HABITAT

The Maryland NWTF (MD-NWTF) contributed over \$30,000 in funding for habitat management on public lands across the state of Maryland in 2024-2025. Habitat management projects include the purchase of a combination of lime, fertilizer, and seed in each of the western, central, and eastern shore regions of the state for wildlife opening maintenance, herbicide treatments in the mid-shore and lower shore regions targeting noxious and invasive plant species, and purchase of herbicide spray rigs for trucks and UTVs as well as the purchase of prescribed fire equipment for the central region.

RESEARCH

The Maryland DNR has undertaken a large wild turkey research project investigating how weather, predators, disease, and habitat impact nesting success and survival of females. Gobbler survival, harvest rates, breeding season timing, and other valuable data will also be collected. MD-NWTF has provided \$20,000 towards the purchase of GPS transmitters used for tracking individual wild turkeys and has provided reward band payments to lucky hunters who have harvested a gobbler tagged with a reward band.

SEED PROGRAM

The NWTF Conservation Seed Program helps seed companies distribute outdated commercial seed that can only be used for conservation purposes. The companies dispose of the surplus, treated seeds they can no longer sell by providing it to the NWTF. MD-NWTF participates in the Conservation Seed Program and offers seed at a nominal cost to members through the local chapter system. If you are a member, please get in touch with your local chapter about requesting seed.

OUTREACH

MD-NWTF has allocated over \$18,000 for education and outreach events in 2024-2025. Events include youth field days (JAKES), Women in the Outdoor (WITO), and Wheelin Sportsmen (Wheelin). Marquee events include the Wheelin Sportsmen hunt on Assateague, First Shot spring turkey hunt at Blackwater, and the National Archery in the Schools program. Local chapters host or sponsor events within their area. If interested in finding an outreach event in your area, check out www.nwtf.org/events.
